New Crisis Shelter Roof

Safe Harbor's emergency shelter provides a critical lifeline for individuals and families escaping domestic violence, but after years of weather exposure, the aging roof had become a safety concern. In February, we successfully replaced the roof on our crisis shelter. This improvement ensures our shelter remains a safe, secure, and stable refuge for survivors, no matter the season. The new roof not only protects the structure but also improves energy long-term sustainability for Safe Harbor.

Transitional Housing Apartments

Safe Harbor completed a transformative project by furnishing 20 and remodeling 3 apartments in our transitional housing program, as well as the hallway stairs, to better support survivors and their families as they rebuild their lives after crisis. Each unit was updated from ceiling to floor with lighting, flooring, furniture, and essentials to create a space that feels safe, dignified, and restorative.

Evergreens Benefit Gala

The Evergreens Gala raised over \$250,000 in vital funds that directly supported our programs and services for thousands of survivors. The evening featured an inspiring survivor story, community awards, auctions, and a shared commitment to building a future free from violence.

Emergency Shelter Updates

With the support of our community partners, Safe Harbor was able to upgrade all lighting in the shelter to energy-efficient LED fixtures and provide 32 new beds for our shelter rooms for individuals in need of a safe place to rest and heal.

Hope Housing

Since completing the furnishing and remodeling of our Hope Housing apartments, we are now operating at 80% capacity.

Prevention Progress

Safe Harbor delivered 95 Healthy Relationship classes, reaching 2,211 students across 12 different high schools and junior highs. One highlight was Healthy Relationships Week at Davis High School, where we engaged students during lunch with interactive activities and meaningful conversations about friendship, dating, family dynamics, and self-worth.
