#### New Crisis Shelter Roof

Safe Harbor's emergency shelter is a critical lifeline for individuals and families escaping violence. After years of weather exposure, the shelter roof had become a growing safety concern. In February 2025, Safe Harbor successfully replaced the roof, ensuring that survivors continue to have a safe, secure, and stable place to seek refuge. This project not only protects the shelter structure but also supports long-term sustainability and energy efficiency.

#### Transitional Housing Apartments

Safe Harbor completed a transformative project within its transitional housing program by furnishing 20 apartments and remodeling 3 units, along with hallway and stairwell improvements.

Each space was updated with lighting, flooring, furniture, and essential household items to create safe, dignified, and restorative homes for survivors and their families as they rebuild their lives after crisis.

#### Evergreens Benefit Gala

The 28th Annual Evergreens Benefit Gala raised more than \$250,000 in vital funding to support Safe Harbor's life-changing programs and services. The evening included an inspiring survivor story, community awards, auctions, and a shared commitment to creating a future free from violence.

#### Emergency Shelter Updates

With the help of generous community partners, Safe Harbor upgraded shelter lighting to energy-efficient LED fixtures and provided 32 new beds for individuals and families in need of a safe place to rest, recover, and heal.

#### Hope Housing

Following the furnishing and remodeling of Hope Housing apartments, the program is now operating at 80% capacity, helping more families move toward safety, stability, and independence.

#### Prevention Progress

Safe Harbor delivered 95 Healthy Relationship classes, reaching 2,211 students across 12 high schools and junior highs. A highlight of the year was Healthy Relationships Week at Davis High School, where students participated in meaningful conversations and interactive activities focused on friendship, dating, family dynamics, and self-worth.
